You'll Travel Over the Historic Bardstown Branch

My Old Kentucky Dinner Train will take you from Bardstown, through the beautiful Bernheim Forest, to Limestone Springs, and return. The train is powered by an early 1940's diesel electric engine and the dining cars are from the mid-1940's.

The train travels over CSX's historic Bardstown Branch which ranks as one of the earliest branch lines of the former *Louisville & Nashville Railroad*. The line dates from 1854 when the *Bardstown & Louisville Railroad* was created.

Old records indicate that the branch was finished to Bardstown by 1860 and that train service began soon after. In 1864 the branch came under L & N's ownership, becoming its "Bardstown Branch." When you ride with us think of those tracks going down more than 130 years ago. In Kentucky we're keeping the romance of the railroad alive. Come join us on our next trip.

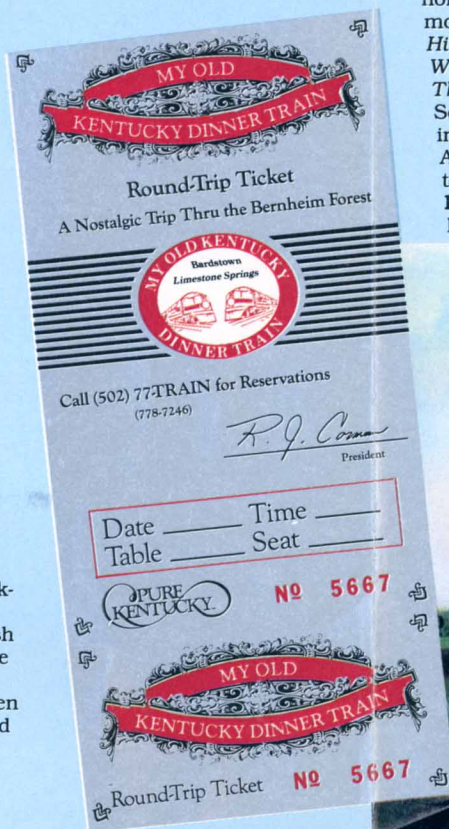
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Your Ticket for a Trip Down Memory Lane
